

ANDY ASKS PROMINENT PSI RESEACHER DR. STEPHAN SCHWARTZ ABOUT HIS WORK WITH CHILDREN IN DARPA'S PROJECT PEGASUS

Dr. Schwartz, When I was a child attached to DARPA's Project Pegasus [1968-72], and we were being trained to prepare us for different forms of quantum access, ranging from remote viewing to time travel, a graduate student or young post doc visited the program and took us through a seminar utilizing Mobius strips to demonstrate certain cosmological principles and relate them to time travel. I have several questions for you. Were you that seminar leader? When you were involved in psi research for the US government, did you ever learn of the existence of Project Pegasus and the fact that the US government was not only using American school children for "psi" testing and training but also involving them in time travel? What explains the deafening silence from the remote viewing community about chronovision? I was first exposed to chronovisors in Fall 1970. Why does the existence of the "Looking Glass" technology rest on the accounts of Dr. Dan Burisch and I and yet those involved in using the human mind to see things at a distance never reference the chronovisor technology even while making alleged disclosures about remote viewing to the public? Do you share my view that the remote viewing literature... especially its obsessive focus on conventional remote viewing but condign ignorance of technical remote viewing via chronovisor, amounts to a "High Psi Disinformation Ploy"? Stephan, Thank you for this candid answer! You are a gentleman and a scholar! As I recall, you were only involved in Project Pegasus by doing a one-day seminar where you worked with us with Möbius strips to explain certain cosmological principles pertaining to the fundamental convolution of the time-space continuum. My guess is that in light of his extensive involvement training us on the teleporter and the chronovisor and his Navy link to our debriefers with the Office of Naval Intelligence, Jack Pruitt was our briefer. That would explain his later role as the research director of Project Montauk, where he continued to work with children in a more focused set of time travel activities involving the Montauk chair.
