

ANDY DECLARES "LANDSLIDE VICTORY" FOR TRUTH CAMPAIGN IN COAST-TO-COAST AM INSTA-POLL ABOUT TIME TRAVEL COVER-UP



SEATTLE, WA (Project Pegasus) November 18, 2010 – The Washington lawyer who is waging a "truth campaign" to urge the US government to disclose the fact that it achieved time travel 40 years ago and deploy its secret teleportation technology globally has won handsomely in a recent poll about his claims.

Andrew D. Basiago, 49, appeared as a guest on talk radio's Coast-to-Coast AM with George Noory on November 11th. It was his second appearance on the popular late night show, which each night commands a listening audience of 15 million people.

During the broadcast, Basiago described his time travel experiences as a child in DARPA's Project Pegasus, which, he says, was the US time-space program at the time of its emergence in the late 1960's.

After the show, Coast-to-Coast AM conducted an Insta-Poll into whether its listeners believed the lawyer's allegation that the US government achieved time travel before 1970 and has kept it secret ever since.

In the opinion poll, Coast-to-Coast AM asked those visiting its website, "Do you believe the government experimented with time travel and teleportation in the 1960's and 1970's?" The results were telling.

Do you believe the government experimented with time travel and teleportation in the 1960's and 1970's?

Yes, the government has amazing technology it keeps secret from the public:	64.27% (4,872 votes)
No, there's no evidence for such a claim:	19.71% (1,494 votes)

In a super-majority victory, Basiago's truth campaign about the time travel cover-up won overwhelmingly. The "Yes" vote in support of his assertion that the US government is involved in a "quantum cover-up" outpolled the "No" vote by 64% to 19% – a ratio of more than 3-to-1. He won 76% of the "Yes/No" vote. "Thank you, George!" Basiago wrote Noory afterwards. "The child time traveler in me is smiling!"
